The Summer School favours a political science approach offering interpretations that are useful to better comprehend the main critical issues at the regional level and, at the same time, to pay attention to the ongoing dynamics in some of the countries where the revolts of the 'Arab Spring' were generated

The working language is English and participation is open to students and professionals willing to critically explore the complex facets of the political dynamics of the Middle Eastern Region

Students who do not live in the Torino area can apply for one of the 10 FREETORINO scholarships which cover accommodation and part of the meals for the duration of your stay in Torino
